Daniela Ciaffi is architect and community planner, associate professor in Sociology of the city, the territory and the environment at the Turin Polytechnic in Italy.

She is expert in community-based urban and spatial transformations, making action-research experiences of participatory urban planning since the late nineties and studying sustainability-environmental, social, economic and institutional of international cases in the Western world.

In the last five years she is focused on collaborations between active citizens and local public administrations through innovative tools in Europe and in Italy, such as the local regulations to take care and regenerate the commons. She is vice president of Labsus, the laboratory for Subsidiarity.

She has participated in a number of European project and she is actually involved in international networks of research. She is often invited in public debates about participative processes and the common goods.

Her most important books are *History, paths and policies of subsidiarity* edited with Filippo Maria Giordano (forthcoming in february 2020, it will be published by Il Mulino, Bologna), *Turin. Economy, government and urban spaces in a city in transformation* written with Luca Davico, Silvia Crivello and Alfredo Mela in 2019 (published by Rubettino), *Community action and planning. Contexts, drivers and outcomes* edited with Nick Gallent in 2014 (published by Policy Press, Bristol) and *Participative planning. Models and experiences* written with Alfredo Mela in 2011 (edited by Carocci, Rome).
