

The above graph reflects the total reported incidents per month since August 2016.


We are disappointed to record a significant increase in incidents this month, the highest since July 2020, with increases in the following categories:

- Vehicle related incidents (23 recorded, up from 6 last month including 6 battery thefts and 6 attempted battery thefts);
- General theft (11 recorded, up from 8 last month) including 4 incidents involving individuals operating
 under false pretences (colloquially referred to as "conmen") being given access to premises by occupants
 resulting in theft of items from the premises;
- Robberies / muggings (12 recorded, up from 2 last month) with the return of our student population, nightlife has increased, with some patrons overindulging. Foot traffic through the streets between places of residence and the entertainment venues has significantly increased with curfew hours being ignored in many instances. Criminal elements have noted these behaviours and are taking advantage. Two thirds of all robberies occurred after 23h00 and a third of these occurred during curfew hours.

OBSID public safety personnel supported SAPS in 8 arrests during the month of March 2021.

- 03 March 2021 Lower Rochester Road, theft
- 17 March 2021 Arnold Street, malicious damage to property
- 20 March 2021 Nansen Street, trespassing
- 20 March 2021 Lower Wrensch Road, housebreaking and theft
- 23 March 2021 Ossian Road, trespassing
- 23 March 2021 Lower Main Road, LPR (licence plate recognition) reported vehicle. Suspects linked to theft of a motorcycle case
- 26 March 2021 Main Road, theft
- 28 March 2021 Scott Road, malicious damage to property.

SUMMARY:



Thefts recorded the highest number of incidents (39) broken down as follows – theft of motor vehicle (2), theft out of motor vehicle (5), attempted theft out of motor vehicle (8), theft of car parts (8), general theft (11), attempted theft (1), theft of motor cycle (1), theft of bicycle (2) and attempted theft of motor vehicle (1).

Robberies recorded (12) incidents, 10 more as reported in February 2021.


Other reported crimes were housebreaking and theft (3), attempted housebreaking (1), assault (2), malicious damage to property (7), trespass (5) and fighting in public (1).

Pro-active engagement (e.g. reports of suspicious activity / persons / vehicles) from the community is down compared to the previous month (08 reports as compared to 11 received by the Control Room during February 2021).

The OBSID public safety team are having to inform owners or residents of unlocked vehicles, open doors, and open garages or premises gates. OBSID's public safety team recorded 130 proactive incidents this month compared to 141 proactive actions last month.



TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY AND MAP:





INCIDENTS BY TIMES OF DAY (AS REPORTED):




SUMMARY OF ACTIVE PERIODS FOR THE MONTH:
















INCIDENTS BY STREET:

The incidents were scattered throughout the area. Streets that recorded more than one incident were not on the same day and occurred on separate days throughout the month. The visibility by the public safety officers is making it more difficult for perpetrators to commit offences hence the increase in opportunistic crimes and decrease in property related crimes.

OBSID RESPONSE TEAM DEPLOYMENT STRATEGY DURING THE MONTH:

As soon as the upturn in the number of reported incidents was noted, immediate actions were taken, including:

- An improvement discussion with the service provider management team, facilitating the holding of a supervisor team meeting to address issues and concerns, plus additional management support being provided to the deployed personnel;
- Refresher training of supervisors and drivers on patrol patterns, information gathering, monitoring and sharing of information on suspected perpetrators;
- Daily shift briefs held with all shifts to discuss crime patterns, suspicious behaviours;
- Weekend "show of force" shifts executed by the OBSID and Securitas management teams to back up the deployed public safety officers;
- Community feedback led to the identification of an individual suspected of being involved in vehicle related crime incidents. Public safety officers were able to monitor his movements through the area without harassment of the person and a significant drop in vehicle related incidents was noted later in the month which has continued into April 2021.
