



The above graph reflects the total reported incidents per month since August 2016.

For the period 1-31 July 2021 there were 49 incidents reported.

SUMMARY:



Thefts recorded the highest number of incidents (28) broken down as follows – theft of motor vehicle (1), theft out of motor vehicle (9), attempted theft out of motor vehicle (2), theft of car parts (6), general theft (5), attempted theft (2), theft of motor cycle (2) and theft of bicycle (1).

Other reported crimes were robberies / muggings (4), housebreaking and theft (6), trespass (2) and malicious damage to property (7).

JULY 2021

Pro-active engagement (e.g. reports of suspicious activity / persons / vehicles) from the community is the same compared to the previous month (16 reports, the same as received by the Control Room during June 2021).


The OBSID public safety team are having to inform owners or residents of unlocked vehicles, open doors, and open garages or premises gates. OBSID's public safety team recorded 171 proactive incidents this month, 23 less than last month.





Highest incident periods: our problematic day was Monday, Wednesday and Friday.


The high number of late reports makes it difficult to accurately determine when incidents occurred – however it appears as if the majority of incidents are taking place between 12h00-06h00.











INCIDENTS BY STREET:

The incidents were scattered throughout the area. Streets that recorded more than one incident were not on the same day and occurred on separate days throughout the month. The visibility by the public safety officers is making it more difficult for perpetrators to commit offences hence the increase in opportunistic crimes and decrease in property related crimes.

OBSID RESPONSE TEAM DEPLOYMENT STRATEGY DURING THE MONTH:

OBSID is continuing with focussed actions intended to minimise the opportunities for crime incidents to occur.

A considerable amount of time is spent by our deployed personnel informing owners or residents of unlocked vehicles, open doors, and open garages or premises gates. This seems to indicate a lack of situational awareness by the community, even though crime and the perceived increase in incidents are often the topic of discussion on various social media platforms. We urge the community to increase their vigilance and to report any unusual or suspicious actions / movements of vehicles or people to help us keep Observatory safer.
