
This report reflects incidents as reported by our team, reported by members of the public to our 24-hour control room or reported via the Obs WhatsApp groups.


The above graph reflects the total reported incidents per month since September 2019.

For the period 1-30 September 2021 there were 74 incidents reported, the highest number of incidents reported since July 2020.

We attribute this increase in part to the significant increase in day walkers / bin pickers in the area as well as a notable uptick in foot traffic in the night which is stretching our resources to their limit.

In addition, we're continuing to spend time highlighting risks to the community related to unlocked properties and vehicles which detracts from normal patrolling and the visibility of our public safety team – this even in a month where an incident involving the theft / hijacking of a motor vehicle with a young child on board sparked community outrage and a call to action to tackle crime. The Obs community has to do better with regards safeguarding their property, and thereby reducing the opportunities for crime to occur.


Thefts recorded the highest number of incidents (39) broken down as follows – theft out of motor vehicle (7), general theft (15), attempted theft out of motor vehicle (5) and theft of car parts (12) – 4 incidents of hub cap theft, 4 incidents of battery theft, 2 incidents of headlight theft and 1 incident each of wheel nut and vehicle badge theft.

Other reported crimes were vehicle hijacking (1), robberies / muggings (11), assault (1), housebreaking and theft (9), trespass (2), shoplifting (1), and malicious damage to property (10).

Pro-active engagement (e.g. reports of suspicious activity / persons / vehicles) from the community is up compared to the previous month (24 reports, 3 more as received by the Control Room during August 2021).

The OBSID public safety team are having to inform owners or residents of unlocked vehicles, open doors, and open garages or premises gates. OBSID's public safety team recorded 259 proactive incidents this month, 72 more than last month.






OBSID public safety personnel supported SAPS in 10 arrests during the month of September 2021.

SUMMARY OF ACTIVE PERIODS FOR THE MONTH:

Highest incident periods: (39) incidents were reported as occurring during the week (Monday to Thursday) and (35) incidents over the weekend (Friday to Sunday).

The high number of late reports makes it difficult to accurately determine when incidents occurred – however it appears as if the majority of incidents are taking place between 12h00-06h00.


INCIDENTS BY DAY:

Start Date: 01/09/2021 End Date: 30/09/2021




INCIDENTS BY TIMES OF DAY (AS REPORTED):






INCIDENTS BY SECTOR:















INCIDENTS BY STREET:

The incidents were scattered throughout the area. Streets that recorded more than one incident were not on the same day and occurred on separate days throughout the month. The visibility by the public safety officers is making it more difficult for perpetrators to commit offences hence the increase in opportunistic crimes and decrease in property related crimes.

OBSID RESPONSE TEAM DEPLOYMENT STRATEGY DURING THE MONTH:

As soon as the upturn in the number of reported incidents was noted, immediate actions were taken, including:

- Refresher training of supervisors and drivers on patrol patterns, information gathering, monitoring and sharing of information on suspected perpetrators;
- Ongoing adjustment of deployment patterns in response to crime trends;
- Daily shift briefs held with all shifts to discuss crime patterns and suspicious activities.

OBSID is continuing with focussed actions intended to minimise the opportunities for crime incidents to occur.

A considerable amount of time is spent by our deployed personnel informing owners or residents of unlocked vehicles, open doors, and open garages or premises gates. This seems to indicate a lack of situational awareness by the community, even though incidents are often the topic of discussion on various social media platforms.

Our OBSID's public safety team recorded 259 proactive incidents this month, **72** more than last month. The current behaviour is making OBSID attractive to criminal elements. OBSID can be deemed an area for easy pickings resulting in more criminal elements moving into the area. The 259 proactive actions by the public safety officers could most likely have resulted 259 more incidents if not attended to.

We urge the community to increase their vigilance and to report any unusual or suspicious actions / movements of vehicles or people to help us keep Observatory safer.
