## Join us in a protest on the 12th November at the Liesbeek River to coincide with the end of COP26

Dear Friends and supporters of the Liesbeek Action Campaign

As you know, our nomination of the Two Rivers Urban Park for provincial heritage status in early 2020 was only processed by Heritage Western Cape in July this year. However, the HWC Council, when it met in July, agreed that the site is so important, that they put it forward to the South African Heritage Agency (SAHRA) to declare the entire park, which include the River Club development site, a national heritage resource. SAHRA are currently in the process of grading the area, whilst the developers continue to barrel ahead with construction, pouring concrete as fast as possible, before our court action to interdict the development and review the approval decisions in the Cape Town High Court. Our interdict, lodged jointly by the Observatory Civic Association and the Goringhaicona Khoi-Khoin Indigenous Traditional Council, will be heard on the 24th and 25th November.

We have an excellent legal team, which includes Cullinans attorneys, some super advocates and Tembeka Ngcukaitobi as our silk.

We believe we have a strong case based on the clearly adverse impacts on heritage (approval declared unlawful by Heritage Western Cape) and the multiple violations of environmental policies involved.

So, we are still campaigning against the development.

And that's the reason I am writing to you.

The World is currently going through its Climate Change mitigation theatre with COP26 running at the moment. We know that the River Club development is not only destructive of a sacred heritage resource but it is deeply contrary to Climate Change mitigation policies. Yet

Jeff Bezos, former CEO for Amazon, who are the anchor tenant for the development and whose commitment underlies the project, is reported to think Climate Change is worth investing \$2bn from his Earth Fund restoring landscapes and transforming food systems. We don't understand the logic of destroying a sacred landscape in Cape Town and then performing on a world stage as a great philanthropist for Climate Change mitigation.

So, on the 12th November, we plan to hold a placard/banner demonstration along Liesbeek Parkway and a ceremony at the Liesbeek River to coincide with the end of COP26.

I am writing to invite you to participate in the event. We would like to be able to populate the entire length of Liesebeek Parkway from the Salt River bridge near the Silo to the plaque opposite Hartleyvale with supporters holding banners or placards. We will hold the demonstration from 3 to 4pm and will then move to a ceremony at the plaque including poems, music, talks and a traditional cleansing to mark the day from 4 to 5pm.
