
PUBLIC SAFETY INCIDENT REPORT

For the period 1-30 November 2021 there were 47 incidents reported, 12 incidents less than reported during October 2021.



Thefts recorded the highest number of incidents (28) of which 2 were attempts only broken down as follows – theft out of motor vehicle (8), general theft (9), attempted theft out of motor vehicle (1), theft of cable (1), theft of bicycle (1) and attempted theft of motor vehicle (1).

Other reported crimes were robberies / muggings (7), assault (1), housebreaking and theft (8), shoplifting (1), trespass (1) and malicious damage to property (1).

Pro-active engagement (e.g. reports of suspicious activity / persons / vehicles) from the community is up compared to the previous month (33 reports, 5 more as received by the Control Room during October 2021).

The OBSID public safety team are having to inform owners or residents of unlocked vehicles, open doors, and open garages or premises gates. OBSID's public safety team recorded 285 proactive incidents this month.



OBSID public safety personnel supported SAPS in 9 arrests during the month of November 2021.


TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY AND MAP:

OBSID SECTORS: INCIDENT MAP: SALT RIVER UITS All CONTROL AND CONT


INCIDENTS OF CONCERN:




SUMMARY OF ACTIVE PERIODS FOR THE MONTH:


Highest incident periods: (26) incidents were reported as occurring during the week (Monday to Thursday) and (21) incidents over the weekend (Friday to Sunday).

The high number of late reports makes it difficult to accurately determine when incidents occurred – however it appears as if the majority of incidents are taking place between 00h00-06h00.






 OBS Red 1, recorded 5 incidents (6) reported the previous month – 69 proactive actions had to be conducted in this area:




 OBS Red 2, recorded 12 incidents (7) reported the previous month – 32 proactive actions had to be conducted in this area:




• Blue 1, recorded 3 incidents (11) reported the previous month – 30 proactive actions had to be conducted in this area:




• Blue 2, recorded 9 incidents (12) reported the previous month – 28 proactive actions had to be conducted in this area:

INCIDENTS BY STREET:

The incidents were scattered throughout the area. Streets that recorded more than one incident were not on the same day and occurred on separate days throughout the month. The visibility by the public safety officers is making it more difficult for perpetrators to commit offences hence the increase in opportunistic crimes and decrease in property related crimes.

OBSID RESPONSE TEAM DEPLOYMENT STRATEGY DURING THE MONTH:

OBSID is continuing with focussed actions intended to minimise the opportunities for crime incidents to occur.

OBSID has seen an increase in muggings in Lower Main Road over the past few days - mobile phones are being grabbed from people's hands, both when in use and when being carried. A silver vehicle has been mentioned in some of the incidents but no other details of the vehicle have been reported.

Please keep items of value out of sight when walking in public spaces. If you need to use your phone, try and move to an area where there are other people around.

After an increase in incidents in Lytton Street we moved a security kiosk to the area and increased the foot patroller, who cover's the Red 2 area, visit frequency.

A new neighbourhood watch (NHW) governing body was elected at their AGM held on the 9th of November 2021. OBSID have met the new chairperson where we discussed best practises. Further meetings will be held to ensure a good working relationship between OBSID and the NHW

We urge the community to increase their vigilance and to report any unusual or suspicious actions / movements of vehicles or people to help us keep Observatory safer.
